HARM REDUCTION

Naloxone Distribution

Naloxone, also known as Narcan, is an opioid blocker that reverses the effects of opioids. It can reverse an overdose caused by an opioid for approximately 30-90 minutes, which means it is still important to call 9-1-1.

Community members can obtain a free naloxone kit at Clermont Recovery Center (1088 Wasserman Way, Batavia, OH 45103). Call 513-735-8100 for an appointment. Naloxone is also available at most pharmacies without a prescription.

Syringe Services Program (The Exchange Project)

Thursdays 10 a.m. - 1 p.m.

The mobile van is located in the Mercy Health Clermont Hospital parking lot.

Services include:

- One for one exchange of sterile syringes
- Testing for hepatitis C and HIV
- Naloxone kits
- Pregnancy test kits
- Education on preventing infection
- Referral to treatment





SIGNS OF AN OVERDOSE

- ⚙️ Loss of consciousness
- ⚙️ Unresponsive
- ⚙️ Awake but unable to talk
- ⚙️ Hands, face or lips turning blue, purple or gray
- ⚙️ Choking sounds, or a snore-like gurgling noise
- ⚙️ Slow, shallow or erratic breathing; not breathing
- ⚙️ Slow or erratic pulse, or no pulse
- ⚙️ Vomiting
- ⚙️ Pale or clammy face
- ⚙️ Not responding to pain
- ⚙️ Limp body

If you suspect someone is experiencing an overdose call 9-1-1 immediately.
