YOUTH

E-Cigarette Use (2017-2018):
Clermont County - 16.4%
Ohio - 10.5%
US - 20.8%



Perception of Harm (2017-2018):
66.0% perceived cigarettes to be very harmful
27.1% perceived e-cigarettes to be very harmful

Illicit Drug Use (2017-2018):
18.3% of 7th - 12th grade students used an illicit drug

Clermont County - 7.5%
Ohio - 8.5%

CONDITIONS AND DISEASE TRENDS

Top Three Reportable Communicable Diseases in Clermont County (2019):
Chlamydia (n=597)
Hepatitis C (Non-perinatal) (n=380)
Influenza-Associated Hospitalizations (n=165)



HEALTH BEHAVIORS

Clermont County Adult Nutrition, Obesity and Physical Activity (2019):
69.5% overweight or obese
49.9% engaged in <150min of aerobic activity per week
38.0% ate at least 1 serving of vegetable per day
40.7% ate 3 or more servings of fruit or fruit juice per day



TOBACCO USE

Adult Current Smoker (2019):
Clermont County - 19.6%
Ohio - 21.1%

ALCOHOL USE

Clermont County Adult Binge Drinking in the
Past 30 Days (2019):

Male - 15.9%

Female - 11.7%

<55 years of age - 18.9%



MENTAL HEALTH

Adult Mental Health (2019):
42.9% felt stressed within the past 30 days
44.8% had one or more days during the past 30 days when
mental health was not good

Youth (9th - 12th grade) Mental Health (2019):
35.7% Felt sad or hopeless everyday for 2 weeks or more
17.3% Considered suicide in the past year
6.9% Attempted suicide one or more times in the past year

INJURY AND VIOLENCE

Accidental Deaths and Overdose Fatalities (2018):

Accidents - 62.7

Accidental drug overdose fatality - 40

Suicide by Method (2017):

Firearms - 34%

Suffocation - 31%

Poisoning - 28%

Other - 7%

ACCESS TO CARE

Clermont County Access to Care Responses (2019):

96% were satisfied with health care received

6.6% could not see a doctor because of cost

6% could not take medication as prescribed

because of cost
